"THE MOTOR YACHT AMO II"

The luxury Yacht "Amo II", formerly the property of the late Honourable Ernest Guinness. Registered in Llyods, 51. Tons. L.O.A. 80'2", L.W.R. 79'9", Beam 11'9", Draft 5'9" fitted with twin screw Parsons 56 h.p. Engine T.V.O., and also fitted with an Auxiliary Engine for lighting and bailing. Built of timber with cooper sheeting in 1918 by Levis of Quebec.

Her accommodation consists of 4. large cabins aft, 3. forehead, ships 12' diningroom saloon, wheelhouse, large engine room. This luxury yacht is complete with cushions, mattresses, spring bases, compasses, clinometers, electric winches, Teak life boat, Gear includes w.h.b's, wardrobes, etc. T.V.O. Tanks, Capacity 1,000 gallons filled fresh. Petrol tank 100 gallons. Water tank 500 gallons. The papers held include a bill of sale. Internal ballast consists of lead, and iron to approx. 4. tons.

This boat was converted in 1928 by the late Ernest Guinness at a cost of £28,000. The engines were overhauled by the makers, Messrs Parsons and Sons, Southampton, about three years ago, and since then have been run regularly once a week and are in perfect condition. On her trial runs in Galway Bay a speed of 10 knots was attained. This boat has an Engine room fitted out second to none, as indeed money was not spared by the previous owner in the complete layout.

Recently the T.V.O. Tanks were removed and completely cleaned out and refilled with fresh T.V.O. Electric lighting throughout is worked off Nife Batteries which are charged direct by the two main engines or alternatively by an auxiliary engine for this purpose and which engine is also used for the Bilge pumps.
